



ARCHIBALD DAWNAY SCHOLARSHIPS

for the promotion of study in Civil Engineering

The Archibald Dawnay Scholarships were established in 1921 by the London County Council from a bequest made by Sir Archibald D Dawnay, formerly Mayor of Wandsworth. The purpose of the Scholarships is the promotion of study in Civil Engineering and the Awards, up to £400.00 in value, are open to full time students ordinarily resident in the former London County Council area – i.e. Camden, City of London, Greenwich, Hackney, Hammersmith, Islington, Kensington & Chelsea, Lambeth, Lewisham, Southwark, Tower Hamlets, Wandsworth and Westminster – who are currently following courses in Civil Engineering, Structural Engineering as applied to building, Surveying, or other preliminary or related courses held at schools or institutions of Further or Higher Education as approved by the Archibald Dawnay Scholarships Trustees.

Scholarships are normally held for 1 year, subject to satisfactory reports on the scholar's work, progress and attendance. To be eligible for a Scholarship, candidates must:

- be current residents of the area formerly administered by the London County Council, as of 30th June 2009 or prior to this date
- be currently attending a full time course of instruction approved by the Trustees
- be 16 years old or over.

In making the awards, the Trustees will have regard to the financial needs of students; with this reservation, scholarships may be held concurrently with other awards.

The number of Awards made in any year will be regulated by the amount available for disbursement in that year. It is expected that approximately 20 awards up to a maximum of £400 each will be made for 2010/2011. Previous Scholars are ineligible to reapply.

Completed application forms, supported by a recommendation from a course tutor, copy of London Education Authority Student Support/Award letter (where applicable), and evidence of residential status should be returned by 7th January 2010 to: Head of Adult Skills & Community Learning (Dawnay Scholarships), City of London, PO Box 270, Guildhall, London EC2P 2EJ

Candidates may expect to be advised whether their application has been successful within 10 weeks of the closing date. In approved cases, payment will be made by cheque after the current academic year has been completed, upon receipt of a report (indicative length: one side A4) of the scholars' academic activities during the year relevant to the Scholarship and receipts or other proof of expenditure related to the course.
