

**CHARGES TO BE LEVIED FOR THE INSPECTION OF CATCH
CERTIFICATES UNDER REGULATION (EC) N^o 1005/2008**



To come into effect on 1st April 2011

There are two basic fees that can be charged **per consignment** for the services carried out when inspecting catch certificates.

£40.00 All **high risk** third country consignments, including low risk origin fish processed in a third country.

£20.00 All **low risk** consignments including EU/ EEA/EFTA and countries with a bilateral agreement with the EU for IUU purposes

A sliding scale can be applied when checking multiple catch certificates submitted **as part of one consignment**. The IUU regulation defines consignment:-

Consignment means products which are either

- *sent simultaneously from one exporter to one consignee, or*
- *covered by a single transport document covering their shipment from the exporter to the consignee.*

Number of certificates	3 rd Country	EEA/EFTA/Bilateral
1-5	£40.00	£20.00
6-10	£60.00	£35.00
11-20	£70.00	£45.00
21+	£80.00	£55.00

Note:-

- Fish caught by a vessel registered to an EU/ EFTA/ Bilateral country and subsequently processed in another third country loses its low risk status and is charged at the appropriate rate.
- the number of certificates is counted per country to reflect the amount of work incurred in checking the certification
- e.g. where a consignment processed in China is accompanied by a catch certificate from Norway and two catch certificates from Russia, the charge would be £80.00 made up of a £40.00 charge for the two Russian Certificates and a £40.00 charge for the Norwegian certificate, which is no longer considered to be low risk as it was processed in another third country.
